In order to receive an Achievement Pin each year, the member must complete the requirements outlined for each Achievement Pin during the current 4-H year. Activities may only be counted once (no duplicates). **DO NOT USE THE FORMS FROM THE STATE.**

Guidelines for Marais des Cygnes Member Achievement Pins are:

- Only **ONE** Achievement Pin can be received by a 4-H member each year. 4-Hers may receive Special Awards such as the Kansas 4-H Key Award or I Dare You Award with a Member Achievement Pin.
- A pin may be skipped, but once a pin is skipped, a 4-Her may not go back and apply for it. For example: If a member received the Bronze Pin in 2016 and the Emerald in 2017, he/she cannot go back and apply for the Clover Pin in 2018.
- INDEPENDENT 4-H Members are NOT eligible for Member Achievement Pins or Special Awards.

- ____ 7. Leadership Pin: Requires Numbers 1 thru 5, plus any 13 from numbers 6-72.
- ____ 8. Gold Pin: Requires Numbers 1 thru 5, plus any 15 from numbers 6-72.
- ____ 9. Gold Guard Pin: Requires Numbers 1 thru 5, plus any 17 from numbers 6-72.
- ____ 10. Year Pin: Requires Numbers 1 thru 5, plus any 10 from numbers 6-72.
