AGENCY/PROGRAM	SERVICE PROVIDED
Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)	Nutrition benefits to supplement the food budget of low-income individuals and families helping them afford the food they need to eat. Apply
Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)	Healthy foods and services to low-income pregnant and breastfeeding women, new moms, and kids under age 5. Find out how to apply.
The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)	Free USDA commodities to households who are in need. Find a site near you.
Summer Food Service Program	Free nutritious meals and snacks provided to all children 18 years old and under at approved SFSP sites in areas with significant concentrations of low-income children when school is not in session. Find a site near you.
Senior Nutrition and Resources	Prepared meals for eligible seniors through various setting such as congregate meal sites, home delivery or grab-and go locations. Food Pantries and Banks	Emergency hunger relief. <u>Find a foodbank near you</u>
Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)	Monthly financial support to qualifying low-income families with children to help them pay for basic needs, including shelter, utilities, diapers, and transportation. Apply
Hero Relief Fund	Childcare subsidies for essential workers who have countable gross income at or below 250% of the federal poverty level.
Tax Relief and Economic Impact Payments	Tax help for taxpayers, businesses, tax-exempt organizations, and others – including health plans – affected by coronavirus (COVID-19).
Kansas Works	Assist individuals who have lost a job, been laid off, or are seeking employment.

AGENCY/PROGRAM	SERVICE PROVIDED
<u>Unemployment Insurance</u>	Unemployment insurance for those not working or working reduced hours due to COVID-19.
Evictions or Foreclosures Protection	Executive Order 20-10, issued by Governor Kelly, temporarily prohibiting certain foreclosures and evictions in Kansas due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This protection extends until May 1, 2020 or until the statewide State of Disaster Emergency expires – whichever is earlier.
