AGENCY/PROGRAM	SERVICE PROVIDED
<u>Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)</u>	Nutrition benefits to supplement the food budget of low-income individuals and families helping them afford the food they need to eat. <u>Apply</u>
<u>Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)</u>	Healthy foods and services to low-income pregnant and breastfeeding women, new moms, and kids under age 5. <u>Find out how to apply.</u>
<u>The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)</u>	Free USDA commodities to households who are in need. <u>Find a site near you.</u>
<u>Summer Food Service Program</u>	Free nutritious meals and snacks provided to all children 18 years old and under at approved SFSP sites in areas with significant concentrations of low-income children when school is not in session. <u>Find a site near you.</u>
Senior Nutrition and Resources	<p>Prepared meals for eligible seniors through various setting such as congregate meal sites, home delivery or grab-and go locations. <u>Food Pantries and Banks</u>	Emergency hunger relief. <u>Find a foodbank near you</u>
<u>Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)</u>	Monthly financial support to qualifying low-income families with children to help them pay for basic needs, including shelter, utilities, diapers, and transportation. <u>Apply</u>
<u>Hero Relief Fund</u>	Childcare subsidies for essential workers who have countable gross income at or below 250% of the federal poverty level.
<u>Tax Relief and Economic Impact Payments</u>	Tax help for taxpayers, businesses, tax-exempt organizations, and others – including health plans – affected by coronavirus (COVID-19).
<u>Kansas Works</u>	Assist individuals who have lost a job, been laid off, or are seeking employment.

AGENCY/PROGRAM	SERVICE PROVIDED
<u>Unemployment Insurance</u>	Unemployment insurance for those not working or working reduced hours due to COVID-19.
<u>Evictions or Foreclosures Protection</u>	Executive Order 20-10, issued by Governor Kelly, temporarily prohibiting certain foreclosures and evictions in Kansas due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This protection extends until May 1, 2020 or until the statewide State of Disaster Emergency expires – whichever is earlier.
