

Garden Spotlight

Miami County Courthouse

Looking magnificent in all seasons, the Miami County Courthouse was built in 1898 and is now listed on the National Historic Register. It has a foundation of Carthage Limestone with the walls made of fireproof pressed bricks. The roof is black with red slate on the tower and gables. The interior is quarter sawn oak with a natural finish. It was built at a cost of \$45,000. This beautiful building is a showcase for our community!

The Marais des Cygnes Master Gardeners began working with the Lions Club and County Commissioners in 2008 to make huge improvements to the historical grounds surrounding the Courthouse. A sidewalk helped improve the flow of pedestrian traffic through the beautiful gardens. The installation of a water sprinkler system helped immensely with the plantings to survive the hot, dry Kansas summers. The gardens have expanded over the years becoming a Monarch Watch with the beautiful butterfly gardens which are covered with Monarchs in the Fall.

Phyllis B. has chaired or co-chaired the Courthouse Gardens since 2012. In the past Phyllis worked with the Lions Club but with the Lions Club disbanding in December 2022, she will work with Superintendent of Grounds, County Commissioner or County Administrator depending on nature of the project. What a great job Phyllis

Gale McRoberts: "The Art of Gardening Monet Style"

Gale has been a lifelong gardener. After raising her family, she entered the Johnson County Extension Master Gardening Program. Since 2010 she has worked in the Monet Garden at the Overland Park Arboretum. She also serves as a bed captain of the South Walk section of the garden. As a bed captain, she is responsible for the planning and ordering of plants, the planting and weekly maintenance of the garden as well as the collaboration with fellow bed captains and the coordination of volunteers working in her section.

As an artist, her interest in Monet aligns with both his works of art as well as his famous garden in France. She has conducted historical research on Claude Monet to prepare this presentation which provides insight into how Claude Monet used color and design elements to create a unique gardening style. She will be taking us on a tour of both the Garden in Giverny, France, and our award-winning Monet Garden right here in Overland Park.
