Presentation Description - Tick Talk - Aug 20th, 6:30p, Presented by Bob Burns

Briefly... This presentation will cover what has been learned about the seasonal abundance of ticks in our state, their disease-carrying capabilities, and how we can coexist safely with these little critters. The discussion will help you understand the peak times of tick activity and define some measures to minimize the risks ticks pose. Sue Burns will discuss the medical aspect.

The information for this talk is based on a presentation by Marlon E. Cobos, Phd that he delivered at the Kansas University Field Station on April 12, 2024. Slides used with his permission.
