"Using Dried Botanicals in Medicinal Products" - Janet will bring some of the dried herbs and plants used in her products and explain the drying process. She will also bring examples of her products and discuss how their natural and medicinal properties work.

Janet Gutierrez, MS - Janet is a retired Medical Social Worker and Adjunct Professor. She became a Certified Professional Aromatherapist when she started making her own skin products after developing severe skin allergies. She has done extensive research in herbal medicine and created a natural product line including healthy skin products, soaps, perfumes, and herbal teas. She uses tree resins and sheep's milk in her products and many homegrown herbs, flowers, and plant material. Spices and natural clays color her soap products naturally and essential oils are used for scenting.
