Miami County Courthouse Garden (Phyllis Benedict)

It has been my privilege to be the Chairman of the Courthouse Gardens Project for the last 12 years. I started right after my Rookie year as a temporary fill-in for Patti Armstrong when she became ill. Years later, it is time to pass the baton to another Master Gardener. The gardens are well established now and only need to be maintained.

It is a big commitment to work two hours a week, every week, from March to October. With 7 large gardens at the Courthouse, there is always gardening to be done, but more volunteers make the work go faster. Note from Rena...

Anita Boyett-Voke wrote an article a few years ago. Jan T. sent it to me (thank you Jan), and I am plagiarizing parts of it to save for future newsletters.

Why give money to the food pantries you ask? While canned goods and fresh produce is a good way to help local pantries, cash donations are equally important. When food is donated you're directly feeding people, but it also creates a large volume of groceries that needs to be stored, categorized and distributed.

The MdC EMGs donate produce from the trial garden every year. While these are most welcome, a cash donation helps food banks with bulk purchases especially when there is knowledge of immediate needs/requirements of the communities they serve.

If you are new to the group, you are probably wondering, "What exactly IS Holiday Happiness?" 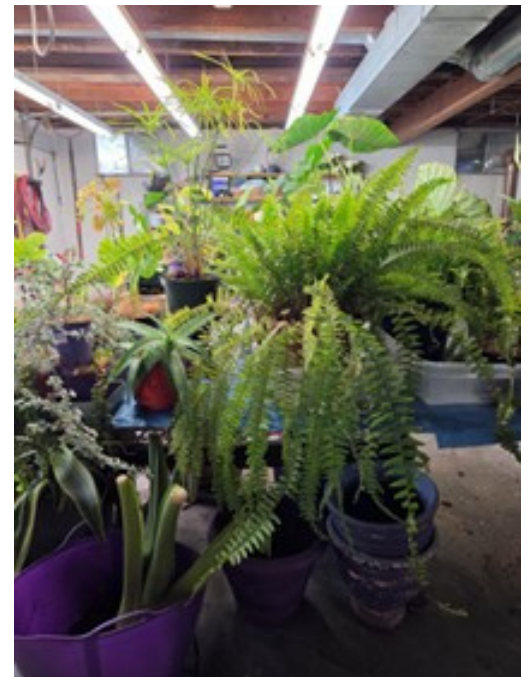
Winter Strategies - Continued info from Panel Discussion on Oct. 28th...

At the EMG Panel discussion on October 28, I shared my garden's winterizing procedures. The mantra "Leave the leaves" guides me. Also during the fall and winter, I cut all the standing stems and ornamental grass fronds into 4" pieces and lay them down where they had been growing as a weed-suppressing mulch. By summer, the mulch has been digested into compost and by fall, the garden debris becomes a rich black soil. I have not fertilized my garden beds in 44 years because this soil contains all the necessary nutrients for the microbes and plants. I also don't have to buy mulch. My mature and lushly planted gardens produce enough leaves, stems and twigs to cover the two acres with 3 to 4" of mulch every fall. I don't even have a compost pile because no plant waste is removed from the garden. Mother Nature and I agree: no bagging or transporting plant debris for us!

The Faux-Greenhouse

My other overwintering tactic protects my many tropical tender perennials that would perish in our Kansas zone 6a winter. Like human snowbirds who travel to zone 10 regions like Florida, Arizona and south Texas, my plant-snowbirds travel to the zone 10 of my basement. In 2013, I hired an electrician, explained what I wanted, and within 24 hours I had my greenhouse. The 36 running feet of T-8 fluorescent lights installed in the ceiling and a permanent humidifier create a sunny moist tropical climate. Equal numbers of pink-colored (warm) and blue (cool) T-8 fluorescent light bulbs provide the full light spectrum needed by plants. A timer ensures automatic 16-hour days. The concrete floor prevents water damage, and the bathroom sink faucet has a standard garden hose fitting. Watering is simplified by keeping the plants in plastic bins according to their watering needs rather than watering plants individually.



I turn the lights on in mid-October when I start bringing tropical perennials indoors. (Do not bother bringing in annuals; they are genetically programmed to die after one growing season.) The lights are turned off by mid-May when all the plants have been returned outside to my "Tropics of Kansas" garden room, which is conveniently placed by the basement door. Incidentally, this garden also contains winter-hardy perennials that look tropical, like my Musa Basjoo bananas that have survived 18 years outdoors in the snow and ice. They grow to 15 feet every summer

Easy and inexpensive, in 12 years, I've only had to change the bulbs once, and last month I had to replace one of the ballasts. I just stroll downstairs in my slippers to tend my tropical plants. In February, I also start summer bulbs such as caladiums and cannas and grow cuttings such as coleus, plectranthus and various tradescantia vines from the "mother plants" that I brought indoors the previous October. There's even enough light to overwinter blooming lantana, begonia and hibiscus to warm my soul. Invaders like mealy bugs and spider mites are annoying but kept under control with insecticidal soap spray.

You too could have a convenient indoor greenhouse. The challenge is convincing your family to relinquish a precious room for your plants!
